

Aids to help at home

Are you interested in finding out about aids to help you at home??

Westmorland and Furness Council have set up a 'virtual house' interactive tour which shows examples of aids, equipment and solutions that may be helpful to you or a family member to do daily activities around the home, and where they can be purchased/ obtained.

Within the tour you will find information about these items, including things which Westmorland and Furness Council do not routinely provide.

AskSara is an online tool that provides you with a personalised report to tell you about things that you might find useful in your daily life. By answering a series of questions about your needs, AskSara can suggest equipment or ideas that could help you.

It can also show you where you can buy products. It is linked to the Disabled Living Foundation's website which has over 10,000 products, 950 national suppliers and 800 local retailers.

The personalised report is designed to help identify your needs and to give you some suggestions, it does not replace the need for an assessment if you require the assistance of formal social care services.

Carers UK & Access Social Care - AccessAva

Carers UK has teamed up with Access Social Care, a charity that specialises in information and advice for people with social care needs, to help them access easy-to-understand health and social care information at the click of a button.

They have introduced an online tool called **AccessAva** that can help you understand the law on social care in England. The tool can help you find out about the rights you have and the rights of anyone you're caring for and all information is verified by lawyers.



As a Carer, it might sometimes feel like you need to be an expert in the law just to make sure your family member or friend gets the support they have a right to.

Would you like to try a creative textile class?

Together with Adult Learning we are holding a Creative Caesura Journal session led by one of their tutors. Claire.

This is what Claire says about the session: We will be exploring creative textile art processes that help us to focus. We will combine journalling with slowness and the textures and techniques of simple sewing and textile art experimentation. The journals become a slow very personal space for reflection, thinking, not thinking, just sewing, writing, drawing, scribbling and just expressing me through guided creative processes. The world is fast paced with many pressures that we routinely juggle. In these sessions we will seek to pause the noise of those pressures by slowing, reflecting, stitching, writing, sharing. All with the support and tuition of a creative arts textile tutor.

Introducing our new Eden team members



I'm **Steph Connor**, a support worker based in Penrith. I grew up just outside Penrith and have lived here for most of my life, apart from a couple of years when I lived in Suffolk when I was first married. Earlier in my career I worked with young children in a local Nursery. Around 12 years ago I had a change of career and went to work in domiciliary care which I loved doing and found very rewarding. I recently decided to have a change from that and found this job which I am really enjoying. I love being able to help such a wide variety of people of all different ages and backgrounds. I enjoy chatting and getting to know people, and being able to give them assistance, advice and emotional support.

Hello, my name is Angela Allen and I joined the team in November. I live in a lovely little village just outside Penrith with my husband, our 9 vear old grandson and my two dogs Molly and Nelly. When I'm not working or helping my elderly parents out, my favourite place is my garden where I spend my time just pottering about and enjoying the outdoors.

My background is in nursing in both acute and community settings and also Hospice at Home Carlisle and North Lakeland providing care and support to palliative patients and their families. Most recently, before

joining Carer Support Carlisle and Eden, I was a private Carer and so have seen first hand the difficulties faced on a daily basis by the unpaid Carers in our community. These are often invisible and Carers are just quietly 'getting on with it' which is why I enjoy my work so much. I can be that listening ear, or help signpost Carers for further support and advice, making their daily lives just that little bit easier and helping them get their voices heard.

Crinkle Chocolate Cookie Recipe

Ingredients

60g cocoa powder, sieved

200g caster sugar

60ml vegetable oil

2 large eggs

180g plain flour

1 tsp baking powder

70g icing sugar

For a Christmas version. try adding orange zest. mixed spice or cinnamon for a festive flavour!

Step 1

Mix the cocoa, caster sugar and oil together. Add the eggs one at a time, whisking until fully combined.

Step 2

Combine the flour, baking powder, (and orange zest, mixed spice, cinnamon if wanted) and a pinch of salt in a separate bowl, then add to the cocoa mixture and mix until a soft dough forms. If it feels too soft, put in the fridge to chill for 1 hr.


Step 3

Heat the oven to 190C/170C fan/gas 5 and tip the icing sugar into a shallow dish. Roll heaped teaspoons of the dough into balls (about 20g each), then roll in the icing sugar to coat. Put the balls on one large or two medium baking trays lined with baking parchment, ensuring they're evenly spaced apart.

Step 4 Bake on the middle rack of the oven for 10 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to cool – they will firm up as they cool, but still be fudgy in the centre.

These cookies will keep for up to four days in an airtight container.

We have tried accessing local support groups but have found that they aren't relevant to our specific needs, as the experiences and difficulties we face are much different to those with the more typical forms of age-related dementia/Alzheimer's. I would therefore like to set up a support group for people in a similar situation to us (under 70 and diagnosed with young onset dementia). This could be for the Carer and the cared for OR just the Carer.

At the moment, I already meet with a couple of people but would like to extend this out to reach others. If there is enough interest, my aim would be to be able to make this a regular meeting at a fixed venue.

I am happy to hear from people in both Penrith and Carlisle as we could look for a venue somewhere in between.



August 2024 The Rebuild Site Carlisle Perfect for that DIY project you're planning to get underway!

Shop location: The Rebuild Site CIC. Kingmoor Park North, Unit A2 Dukes Drive, Carlisle CA6 4SH

Open: Wed-Sat **10am – 4pm** Sun 10am – 1pm

The Rebuild Site stock a wide range of materials including timber, bricks and blocks, paint, pipes, lintels, drainage, screws, nails, bolts and electrical fittings.

You don't need to buy full packs of materials, so if you are looking for a few bricks to finish a path or are short of a couple of lengths of wood we can provide these at a low cost. Materials are new, surplus or excess materials collected from construction sites, which basically makes them second hand. They may have been stored for a period of time, and some of them might show some light signs of wear and tear, depending on storage conditions prior to us collecting them and the prices reflect this.

The Rebuild Site are part of the Community RePaint scheme, diverting usable paint from incineration. Paint is on sale from £2 per litre.

Materials can be delivered within a 25 mile radius of our shop in Carlisle however, delivery costs £20 for all orders.

Rebuild Tool Library Tools can be expensive for both your pocket and the environment! The average drill is used for 13 minutes in its lifetime. By borrowing you reduce your carbon impact and save money.

Are you a woman who has been identified (either by yourself or formally 'diagnosed') as autistic and/or ADHD as an adult and you like to craft?

My name is Martha and I have recently started a craft group so that we can have a safe space to talk or not talk, with no expectations of trying to fit in or having to mask, especially for those who have a lifetime of that behind us.

Some of us are in the early stages of finding out what being autistic and/or ADHD means in our lives and the conversations have been very affirming as well as interesting and fun.

CEA Cinema Card

The CEA Card is a national card scheme developed for UK cinemas by the UK Cinema Association (UKCA).

The card enables a disabled cinema quest to receive a complimentary ticket for someone to go with them when they visit a participating cinema.

The CEA Card entitles you to ONE free ticket for someone to accompany you to the cinema to provide the assistance you may need during your visit. To get the free ticket, you will need to purchase a full price ticket for yourself for the same performance of the same film in the same auditorium in a single transaction.

The free ticket is provided on the assumption that the person who accompanies you can provide you with appropriate assistance, this might include:

- helping you move around the cinema including finding and taking a seat.
- helping you leave the cinema in the event of an emergency.
- accompanying and/or helping you use the cinema's toilets; helping you buy refreshments.

To apply, the person requiring assistance must be 5 years of age or older and be in receipt of one of the following:

- Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
- Attendance Allowance (AA)
- Personal Independence Payment (PIP) •
- Armed Forces Independence Payment (AFIP)
- Or hold:

 Severely Sight Impaired Registration (formerly Registered Blind), Sight Impaired Registration (formerly Partially Sighted)

When applying for a Card you will be required to send or upload the awarding letter from DWP or a statement confirming receipt of the allowance for the applicant dated within the last 12 months.

Alternatively, for Severely Sight Impaired or Sight Impaired applicants, you will need to send or upload certification for the person requiring assistance.

They will not accept Universal Credit, **Employment and Support Allowance** or being a Blue Badge holder as sole proof of eligibility.

How long is the card valid for?

The Card is valid for 1 year from the date of issue. The date is displayed on the Card.

Is there a cost?

Yes, there is a £6.00 fee which covers the costs of running the scheme, such as, processing applications and producing the card.


How to apply for a CEA card for a child

If your child is between 5 and 16 years of age, an adult will need to apply for a CEA card on their behalf.

Although you are applying for them, they will be the cardholder as they are the person requiring the care.

What will the card look like?

The card will look like this and include your name, photo, expiry date, the CEA emblem and your unique card number.

Investing in families and making sure they get the support they need from birth through to adulthood helps with children's educational attainment, wellbeing and life chances. We also know that the time from birth to the age of 2, lays important foundations for children's emotional and physical development.

By helping to establish nurturing, supportive environments for the youngest members of society, Family Hubs will make it easier for parents and Carers to give their children the best start in life.

SEND Birth-25

The SEND Local Offer is the central information point for families with children and young people aged up to 25 years with special educational needs and/or disabilities. This offer is accessible through the Local Authorities 'Family Hub' websites. Please visit each Authorities Family Hub website for information on what activities and training are available.

SENDAC

SEND Alliance Cumbria (SENDAC) is the official Parent Carer forum for parents and Carers of children and young people with additional needs and disabilities in the beautiful county of Cumbria. Their role is to reach out to families and listen to your concerns and opinions about all SEND services in Cumbria, from EHCP issues to diagnosis processes & concerns about therapy!

SENDAC are the parent voice of Cumbria, they make sure your voice is at the heart of every decision.

To become a member of SENDAC:

You must be a parent/Carer or grandparent to a child or young person with additional needs (age 0-25 years old). Your child does not need an official diagnosis for you to become a member and we support families of children with any type of additional need from complex and profound needs to learning difficulties like dyslexia and physical disabilities.
